PUBLIC COMMENTS –Berrysburg Fire Company is having a scrap metal recycling event on November 8th . Details of this event will be emailed to each municipality and posted on the COG website. Millersburg Fire Company is having an Open House on 19th from 2 to 6 PM. Alan Loesch was contacted by the Sentinel and an article about COG will be in the Sentinel's mass mailing edition.

OLD BUSINESS

Outside Boilers Charles Gallagher said that Berrysburg has passed an outside boiler ordinance, and that they also have a inspection checklist. He talked to Sue Helm about having manufacturing standards for these outside boilers. He also contacted Sen. Holden's office but was referred to Washington. Berrysburg's outside boiler ordinance and a new model ordinance from DEP will be posted on the COG website. Outside boiler ordinances were also recently passed in Elizabethtown and Millersburg.

PROJECTS

Recycling Robyn Loesch reported that we will plan on having another computer recycling event next spring. Carsonville Salvage Wreckers (362-9616) can be contacted about free removal of junk cars. One Stop recycling in Lykens was also mentioned as a local resource for metal recycling. Hazelton Automotive has a program where they bring temporary oil and battery recycling containers to a municipality; Robyn will contact Dale Shoop because he had also found an oil recycling vendor.

PENN-DOT Mandated Sign Upgrades

No report. Alan Loesch commented that as we are already considering next years' municipal budgets and that there is now an time extension on the required sign upgrades – we will probably just regroup and revisit this project next year.

UCC Appeals Board

Norma Shearer reported that although Jim Facinelli cannot serve on the UCC Appeals Board, Jack Shiley has said that he is willing to serve on the board. Norma led a discussion about setting the appeal fee. Marty Sowers commented that at least \$1000 was usual in other areas. Ray Deppen said that Lykens Twp. had one zoning appeal go as high as \$1300 and that the majority of the costs were attorney and stenographer's fees; they had only set their up-front fee at \$600 and never recovered the rest of the appeals cost. Alan Loesch made a motion to set the UCC Appeal Board fee at \$1500.00; motion seconded by Ray Deppen. (Unan.)

Upper Dauphin Income Tax Office

Alan Loesch received an email from David Blain with an update on the Tax Office. At this point, it was agreed by all present that they will be waiting until after the audit before tackling the issue of the overpayment distribution issue.

Open Records Law

NEW BUSINESS

Sean Grimm wanted to ask why Medic 6 now only has one MICU in Elizabethtown and Lykens Borough ; and that now a paramedic is going on BLS unit calls. He is concerned that this might create coverage problems. We will ask Robb Wentzel to come to the next COG meeting. It was discussed that Medic 6 had talked about having a COG representative on their board.
